## Comprehension Questions

My goal with comprehension questions is two-fold. First, make sure the kids are making connections. And second, encourage them to think beyod the boundaires of the book. The questions are intended to make the kids think.
Since we read these books multiple times over the course of a week or so, l've put different questions on different days. Day 1 is full of speculation "What do you think will happen next?> Do you notice anything different?". The rest of the week is about making extra connections.

## Comprehension Questions

Day 1.
Page 1: Do you know what a peddler is? A peddler is a person who travels to sell things.
Page after peddler wakes from his nap: Do you notice anything different? What happened to the peddlers hats?
The page when he peddler throws down his ca: What will the monkeys do? Did you notice they are copying the peddler?

## Day 2:

Same questions. See if the kids remember.

## Day 3:

Every time the peddler stacks his caps, pause on the colors to let the children predict which color is coming.

## Day 4 :

On the page with the monkeys: How many monkeys are there? How many caps are there?

Day 5:
If you were a peddler, what would you sell?
